

Policies on authorship and contributorship

1. Scope

This policy applies to all manuscripts submitted to Pomorstvo and to all listed authors and contributors. It sets out the journal's expectations for who qualifies as an author, how contributions should be declared, how authorship order is handled, and how disputes or changes in authorship will be managed.

2. Authorship Criteria

In line with COPE guidance, authorship carries both credit and responsibility. To qualify as an author on a Pomorstvo article, an individual must satisfy *all* of the following criteria:

- Made a substantial contribution to the conception or design of the work; or the acquisition, analysis, or interpretation of data.
- Drafted the work or revised it critically for important intellectual content.
- Approved the final version to be published.
- Agrees to be accountable for all aspects of the work, ensuring that questions related to accuracy or integrity of any part are appropriately investigated and resolved.

3. Author Contributions & Transparency

On submission, the corresponding author must upload a Author Contribution Statement at the end of the manuscript template listing each author and specifying their contribution. The published article will include a contributions section to increase transparency.

The corresponding author must ensure:

- All listed authors have seen and approved the final manuscript.
- All authors agree to authorship order and accept their role.
- No author has been omitted who meets the criteria, and no author is included who does *not* meet the criteria.

4. Acknowledgements and Non-Author Contributors

Individuals who contributed to the work but do *not* meet the criteria for authorship should be listed in the Acknowledgements with their specific contribution described.

5. Changes to Authorship After Submission or Publication

Requests to add, remove, or reorder authors after submission must be accompanied by a written explanation from the corresponding author and all authors (both existing and proposed) confirming agreement to the change. If authorship is changed after publication, the journal will publish a formal correction notice.
