

Policy on intellectual property

1. Scope

This policy applies to all content submitted to and published by Pomorstvo and to all parties involved in the publication process. It sets out how intellectual property (IP) rights are handled, including ownership, licensing, copyright, pre-publication material, and how potential breaches of IP are managed.

2. Principles

For the purposes of this policy, Intellectual Property (IP) includes copyrights, authors' moral rights, database rights, patents (as they affect publication), trademarks pertaining to the material, rights in research tools/instruments, and rights in unpublished material or ideas.

3. Author Rights and Responsibilities

At submission, authors must confirm that the manuscript is original, has not been published elsewhere (in the same form) and is not under consideration elsewhere; they hold the necessary rights to submit the material (including any third-party content, figures, tables) or have obtained permission for reuse; any material included (text, data, images) does not infringe the intellectual property rights of others. Authors retain the moral right to be credited as writers of the work; away from that, the journal/publisher handles distribution under the licence terms agreed.

4. Copyright and Licence Options

Pomorstvo clearly states the licence under which the work is distributed on the journal's webpage.

5. Prior Publication / Preprints

The journal allows prior publications (e.g., conference proceedings, pre-print servers, theses, data repositories) to be submitted to the journal. Authors must declare at submission any prior presentation or publication of the work or substantial parts thereof.

6. Use of Third-Party Material

Authors must obtain and cite permissions for any third-party material (text, figures, tables, data) that is under copyright.

7. Plagiarism, Text Recycling, Duplicate/Redundant Publication

Pomorstvo prohibits plagiarism, including unattributed use of another's ideas, data, text, or images; self-plagiarism (re-publishing one's own previous work without appropriate citation/justification); and redundant publication (submitting substantially the same research to multiple outlets, i.e., "salami-slicing") unless clearly stated and justified. The journal uses plagiarism-detection tools and may perform manual checks to identify overlap. If significant overlap or IP misuse is detected, the

journal will follow its misconduct policy to investigate and, if confirmed, issue appropriate corrective action (correction, retraction, withdrawal).

8. Reviewers and Editors' Use of Submitted Material

Reviewers and editors must treat all submitted manuscripts as confidential and must not exploit ideas, data, or unpublished material for their own work. Editor(s) handling manuscripts submitted by themselves, their close collaborators, or where they have a competing interest must recuse themselves to protect impartiality and respect IP rights.

9. Breach of Intellectual Property Rights

If a claim is made that an article infringes the IP rights of another party (for example, appropriation of ideas, unauthorised use of data, images, or text), Pomorstvo will investigate according to its misconduct policy.
